


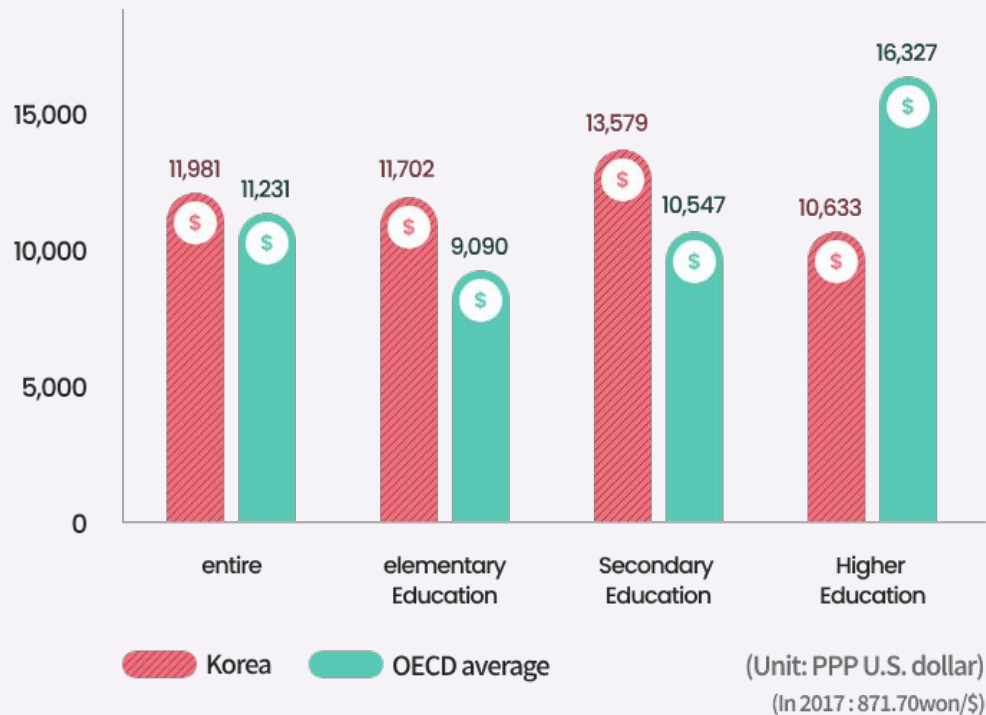

# High Emphasis on Education

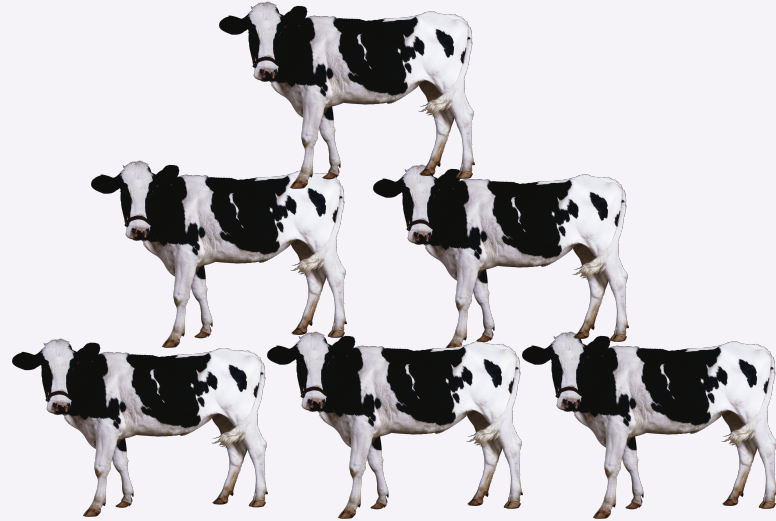

# Cow-Tower

- Japanese colonial rule (1910-1945) stunts education
- Korean language and history prohibited
- After liberation, there was a lack of government support in schools
- Parents sold cows and land to support children's education





## **5.31 Education Reform**

- Initiated in 1995; origin of Korea's culture regarding education
  - Reform to increase education levels rapidly
  - Little regard for long term effects



## **Brain Drain**

- Korean talent leaving to seek jobs in other countries
- Loss of competent workforce that are crucial for the economy

## 7th Curriculum

- Combats effects of 5.31 reform
- Emphasis on less traditional jobs
- deregulation of schools, focus on extracurriculars
- Prepares students for real-world application to global world

## American school reform

- US school system produced mediocre student performances

- Copies policies on testing and curriculum from Korea

- Some South Korean women found **refuge** in the United States, **escaping gender discrimination** and **finding more opportunities**
- The U.S. is perceived as a place where women have **increased opportunities**
- Higher **education levels**, exposure to **mass media**, and expanded **job opportunities**

## South Korea

Women were confined to the home, while men worked. However, the **Republic of Korea in 1948** gave women constitutional rights for equal opportunities.

## United States

In the U.S., women have been active in the workforce for decades, with the **number of working mothers steadily increasing.**

# Challenges in South Korea

- In **1987**, South Korea enacted the **Equal Employment Act**
- Challenges: gender-based exclusion, wage gaps, and underrepresentation in leadership roles
- **Younger** generations vs. **older** generations
- South Korea ranks **115th** out of **145** nations in a gender equality study

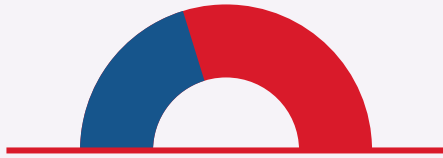
## Wage gap between men and women

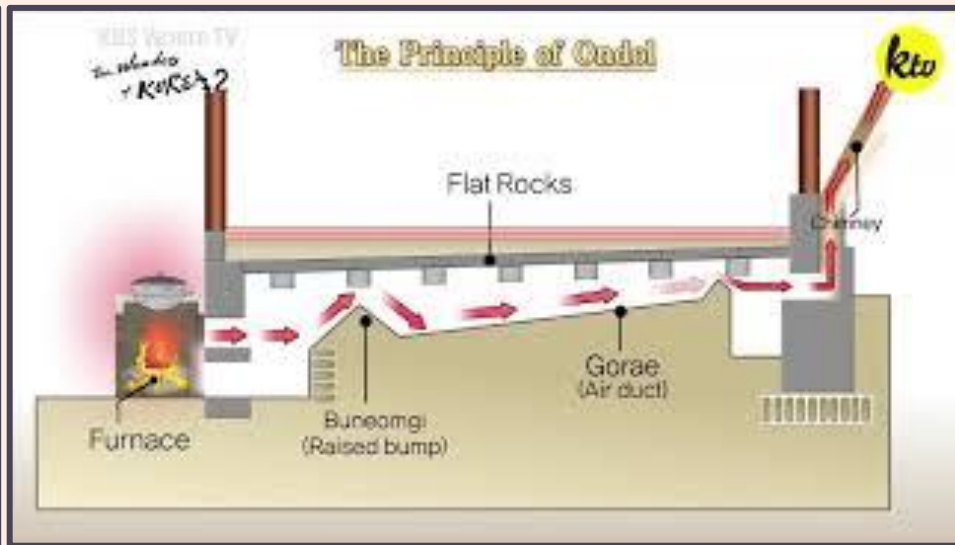

- ☆ Korea's aesthetic is presented in global cities





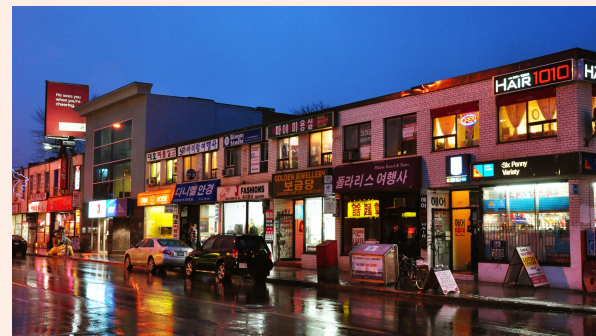

# Popularity of South Korean K-pop Worldwide as of December 2022

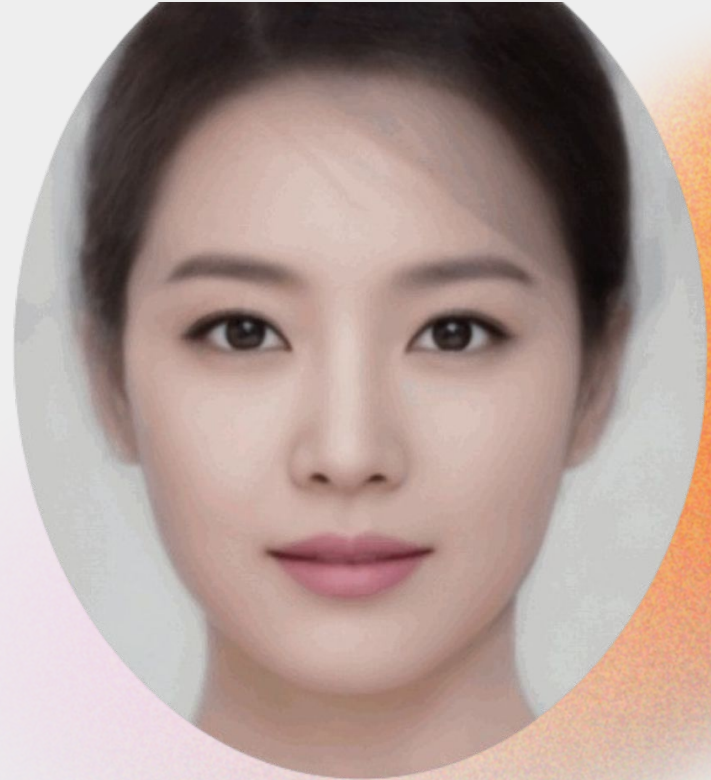

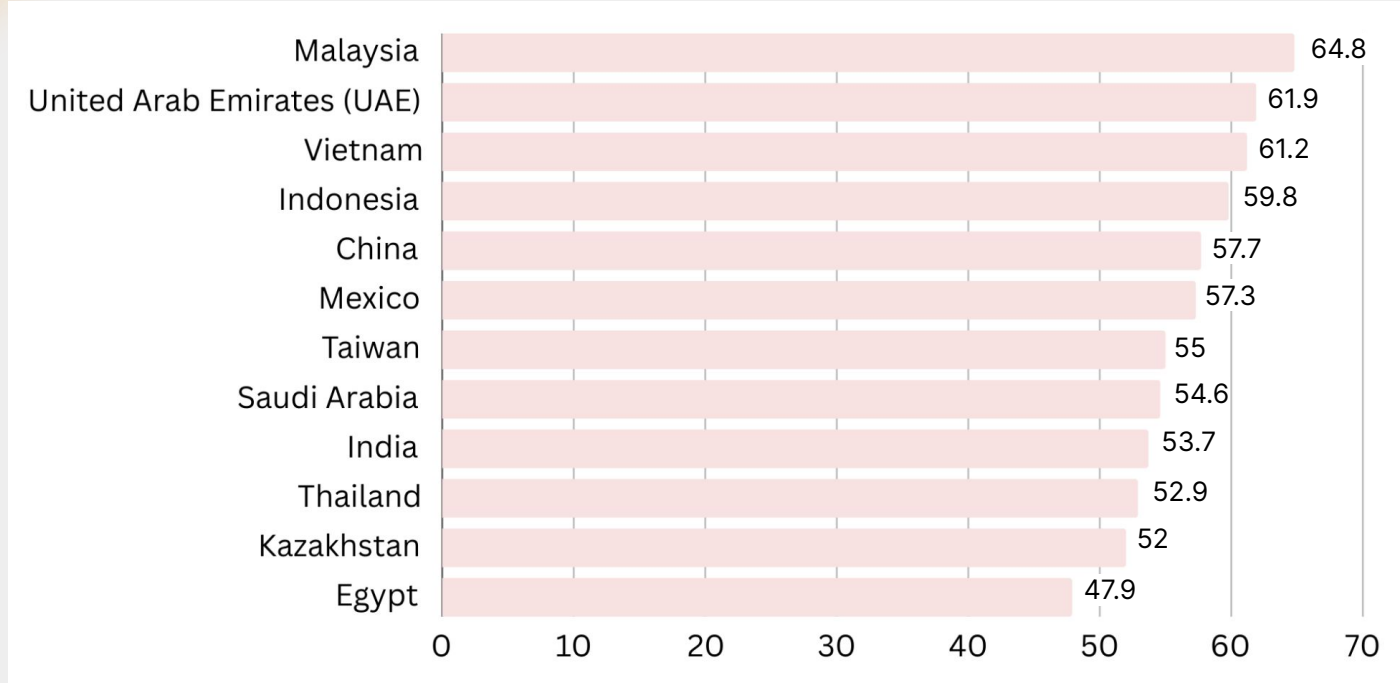

# Skincare Wave

- Korean beauty first debuted in the West after the launch of BB Cream
- Korean cosmetics exports rose 90% in Indonesia, 55% in Southeast Asia, 60% in the UK, the US rose to 21%
- 2023: K-beauty market is worth 10 billion

Why did K-beauty become so popular?

- Easy to read, clean ingredients
- Concerns/awareness raised by social media
- 10 step beauty routine was popularized



# K-Beauty Brands

## Korean v. Korean American Brands

- Korean: brands that are popular in Korea and assimilated into Western market
- Korean American: Korean brands that are more known in Western markets

## Amorepacific Group

- Korea's leading beauty company

- Kpop and KDramas are a very big part of Korean pop culture
- Inspires many undergo facial or bodily procedures

Kpop and Kdramas are heavily associated with Korean beauty standards, as all of the idols portrayed in the media fit most of the standards perfectly. Appearance is very important to many Koreans for jobs and social acceptance, so many get surgeries to fit the standards more.

The global plastic surgery market was 45.55 billion dollars in 2022, and the Korean plastic surgery market is valued at 3.7 billion dollars (5 trillion Won).

- Many girls are encouraged to get plastic surgery, even at an early age
- Double-eyelid surgery is a popular teen-birthday or graduation gift in many households
- Some estimates have shown that 33% of South Korean women between ages 19 - 29 have had cosmetic surgery, others higher

In conclusion, South Korea is considered to be one of the most cosmetically-enhanced countries worldwide.


